Maggie Scott of the Duchess Nina Nursing Home celebrated her 100th birthday on Tuesday 21st February. The Duchess Nina hosted a celebration party attended by most of the family, including two of her children, 10 grandchildren and 9 great grandchildren. "Wee Maggie" as she is fondly known, was born in Blantyre in 1906, making her four years older than the Duchess Nina building itself, which was built in 1910.

We have struggled for players recently so we are glad to see the new boys joining us. Hopefully with a bigger squad we can cope better with the games. The Soccer Sevens is a very well set up association with our age group having over 30 teams. Some are very good and play to a very high standard. Several of the teams have been established for many years and they are well known in all age groups throughout Lanarkshire. Although we are a very new and young team we are starting to get settled and hopefully in 2006 we will start to make an impression. The association rules mean that there are no points to play for; no official league tables and all games are classed as friendlies. The intention is to get the players introduced to football and being part of a team. Having said that the games can be deadly serious at times.

We are looking at setting up a second training night during the week to try and give the boys an edge to their play that is lacking at the moment. However this all costs money and there is only so much self-funding that can be done. The team recently issued letters to over 30 local businesses requesting financial assistance in return for a sponsorship deal. We felt that if we ask for a small amount from several businesses it would be more appealing than asking for a large amount of money from one business. The successful sponsor would be drawn out of the hat. Although we had a good response we unfortunately did not reach the target amount. The intention was to raise enough to purchase new strips, kit bags and training tops. At this stage we are starting with the new kits and are pleased to announce that the successful sponsor is Ballantynes Milk.

### *Neighbourhood Watch*

**South Lanarkshire Council Grant** — SLC gave Quarter Neighbourhood Watch a generous Christmas Grant with which the committee were able to make up emergency packs for the village pensioners. These packs contained leaflets on what to do in an emergency and some handy information, hints and tips for everyday living. The packs also contained a torch, a flask and some food items for use in times of severe weather. Over 100 packs were handed out to village and surrounding area pensioners.
