# **OUARTER PRIMARY SCHOOL**

The new session at school got off to a good start with 107 children in the school and 14 in the nursery. Two pupils have won national competitions, namely Gordon Swan who was third in the Utterly Butterly Build a Bi-plane Competition, winning £300 for the school and Darren Ferguson who was first in the Jet Smile n' Safe Competition, winning £500 for the school.

The school is working hard at the moment to attain a Health Promoting School Silver Award. On Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> October the whole school took part in a "Chest, Heart and Stroke" Playground Game event. This event not only raises funds for the Association but helps to increase the level of fitness of the pupils taking part. New playground games have been painted on the playground and lots of new toys bought to make playtimes more fun. This also encourages the children to take part in more physical exercise.

On a more sombre note, residents in the village should be made aware of the trouble the school is having with older children who congregate in front of the school grounds in the evenings. At the last Parent's Night a window was smashed at the school, this being the third incidence this year of windows being broken. This poses a danger for our children, and residents are asked to keep a watchful eye for offenders and make reports to the police if any criminal activity is observed. Application has been made to the Education authorities for extra lighting and CCTV to be installed.

The Quarter Primary School Board has welcomed two new members to the Board, namely Mrs Jill Clark and Mr David Black. Mr Arthur McWilliams has also joined as a nominated member. The Chairperson

remains as Mrs Myra Milligan and the Vice-Chair Mr Stuart McDowall. The Clerk is Mrs Mabel Anderson and other members are Mrs Christine Marshall and Rev George MacDonald.

The School Harvest Assembly was once again a great success and focussed this year on the Malawi Project. The school is grateful for all the gifts sent in, and these were forwarded to Malawi by Mrs Georgie McMillan, who also addressed the Assembly about the project. 
The facility for the disabled at the Quarter Church has now been put into use and a plaque installed to
