QUARTER PRIMARY SCHOOL



On Thursday 25th January, Quarter P7 went to Glasgow Science Centre with several other schools. We were there to learn about a new project which we are about to take part in. This project is called "Clyde in the Classroom." We will be receiving 250 Brown Trout

eggs to look after for six weeks.

We received the equipment for the eggs on Tuesday 30th January. A man came and taught four of our children and those four taught the rest of the P7. The water temperature has to be kept between 2-10 degrees. We have to freeze 500ml bottles and take the labels off. The tank has two compartments, one for the pump and another for the fish. Any dead fish will be lifted out and put straight in the bin. The compartment with the pump is where the frozen bottles will go to keep the water cool. Once the fish hatch they will have a yolk sack. {We will not have to feed them.} After that they will start to swim about.

Of the 250 eggs; sadly only about ten will live. This is better than in the wild where only one in a thousand survive. The fish will live in the school for six weeks, then after reaching a suitable size, the hatchlings will be released in a local burn or stream.

This project is teaching us about wildlife and how important it is to keep the correct conditions for animals to survive. It makes us think about the effects of "GLOBAL WARMING". By Pupils of QPS



Hi Mr. Johnstone

My grandparents lived in quarter for many years around the mid 1920's. As far as I have been told, my grandmother was the post mistress, her name was Mary Higgins. My grandfather, Arthur Higgins was a school janitor, but I don't know which school. He also served in the First World War in a kilted regiment.

My father went down the pit in Quarter (no. 4, I think) in 1936, at the age of 14 years of age.

My grandparents had a small holding in the village with hens and ducks.

They later moved to William Drive in Eddlewood, I don't know when, but they were there in 1940 circa.

I should be glad if you could provide me with any further information.
